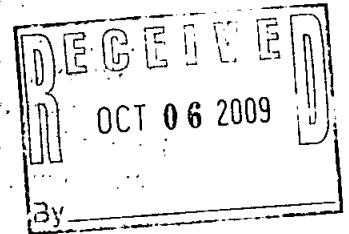


To Whom It may Concern:

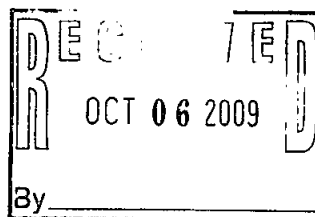
I will say that in other regards they have up-graded the existing house and seem to be taking good care of at least the front property.
