## On the move: Unique vehicle dealership brings 17 jobs to region

> The new Mini dealership will break ground on Wednesday at the Motorplex at Centerra, Interstate 25 and Crossroads Boulevard.

A ribbon cutting ceremony held at 11 a.m. followed by a reception and Mini parade to help celebrate the 50th birthday of the MiniCooper.

The new Mini of Loveland will be at 4055 Byrd Drive just southwest of Co's BMW Center and will be only the second dealership in Colorado to sell the Mini brand.
