

ORDINANCE NO. 76, 1930,

BEING AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE VACATION
OF A PORTION OF ELM STREET LYING NORTH OF BLOCK 375,
OF THE WEST SIDE ADDITION TO THE CITY OF FORT COLLINS,
AND WEST OF THE RIGHT OF WAY OF THE COLORADO & SOUTHERN
RAILWAY.

WHEREAS, The Home Lumber Manufacturing Com-
pany, a corporation, on the 8th day of May, 1930, duly peti-
tioned the City Council to vacate all that portion of Elm
Street north of Block 375, West Side Addition to the City
of Fort Collins, east of North Loomis Street and south and
west of the Colorado & Southern Railway right of way, which
said petition was by the City Council duly referred to the
Commissioner of Works and the City Attorney; and thereafter
the Commissioner of Works and the City Attorney reported
favorably on said petition, provided the petitioner should
secure a favorable expression from the property owners along
Elm Street and the vicinity thereof, favoring said vacation,
and further providing that notice be published in both local
papers and a date set for receiving objections; and

WHEREAS, Petitioner has secured and filed a
favorable petition from the property owners along Elm Street
and the vicinity thereof, and has caused to be published in
both local papers a notice as provided in said report, fix-
ing Saturday, May 29th, 1930, at one o'clock P.M. as the date
for receiving and hearing objections to the granting of said
petition; and

WHEREAS,

no objections have been made
or filed


now, therefore, in consideration of the premisses aforesaid,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT COLLINS:

Section 1. That all that portion of Elm Street lying north of Block 275, West Side Addition to the City of Fort Collins, east of North Loomis Street and south and west of the Colorado & Southern Railway right of way, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Section 3. In the opinion of the City Council an emergency exists for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety, and this ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication, under and by virtue of the authority contained in Sections 6 and 7 of Article IV of the City Charter.

Introduced, read at length and adopted by the unanimous vote of all the members of the City Council this 29th day of May, A.D. 1920.
