Re: May 12 work session: Northern Integrated Supply Project and Poudre River Health Assessment Framework

City Council discussed both the Northern Integrated Supply Project (NISP) and the Poudre River Health Assessment Framework (Framework).

In general, Councilmembers appeared to be supportive of staff's proposed approach to developing a response to the NISP Supplemental Draft Environmental Impact Statement. There were a few questions about how NISP would deliver water both to communities further south and east, as well as to the river itself.

In general Councilmembers were supportive of the Framework project. A Councilmember was concerned that not enough information was presented for Council to be able to form an informed view of the Framework. Questions also were posed about the proposed indicators grading system and how it would be calibrated. Several Councilmembers encouraged the City to pursue high grade ranges related to the river health indicators.

Follow Up Items:

Council requested that the Framework come back to it for a final review and perhaps adoption by resolution.

Re: 5-12-15 Work Session Summary – Social Host Ordinance

Options for considering additional Municipal Code Ordinances were presented to Council by Laurie Kadrach, Community Development and Neighborhood Services Director and Jeremy Younce, Police Services Lieutenant. Additional staff from Neighborhood, Police and Legal Services was present to answer questions. The Mayor and all Council members were present.

Staff was seeking direction on whether to move forward with public engagement on proposed regulations to hold "hosts" who are present and have control and access or use of premises where underage drinking or use of marijuana is occurring accountable. Staff was also seeking direction as to whether to consider adoption of a local ordinance prohibiting underage possession or consumption of alcohol. Lastly, staff was seeking direction on whether to hold landlords or owners of property who were not present when underage consumption of alcohol or marijuana occurred responsible under the City's existing Public Nuisance Ordinance. Council directed staff to move forward with thorough public engagement processes for all proposals and directed outreach specifically to Colorado State University students and Poudre School District.

Council also requested a list of communities, specifically in Colorado that have adopted a Social Host Ordinance. Those cities include: Steamboat Springs, Craig, Gunnison, and Crested Butte. Staff will further research to see if there are others either considering a similar ordinance or that have adopted one.

RE: May 12, 2015 Work Session Summary: Water Supply Reliability and Storage Update

At the May 12 Work Session, Utilities staff made a presentation regarding the Water Supply Reliability and Storage Update for the Utilities water service area. The presentation provided information on the Utilities' current and future water supplies and demands, a description of key elements from the Water Supply and Demand Management Policy pertinent to water supply planning, and an update of the Utilities' water storage projects including Rigden Reservoir and the Halligan Reservoir Enlargement projects. All Councilmembers were present and Utilities staff (Donnie Dustin, Carol Webb, Adam Jokerst and Kevin Gertig) was available to respond to questions. Key points or questions made by Councilmembers were:

- The presentation provided a good background and update on Utilities' water supply needs and water storage projects.
- How are the costs for the Halligan Reservoir Enlargement project tied to the Utilities Raw Water Requirements?
- There is a desire to learn more about the other water districts that supply areas of Fort Collins, including population that will be served by them.

Next Steps

- Continue with the Halligan Reservoir Enlargement permitting process, with the next update to Council being the release of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement.
- Address questions about other water districts, Raw Water Requirements, and project costs in other upcoming Council meetings over the next few months.
