Ordinance No. 6

1902

Relating to street curbing.

Be it ordained by the ^{city council of the} City of Fort Collins, Colorado:

Section 1. That hereafter except as otherwise ordered or directed by the City Council of the City of Fort Collins under its powers and authority as conferred by the ordinances of the city or the statutes of the State of Colorado. No curbing shall be laid in the streets of the city of Fort Collins except upon permission granted by the Committee of the City Council of the City of Fort Collins known as the Committee upon streets, alleys and bridges, and then only in the manner prescribed herein.

Section 2. All curbing hereafter constructed upon any street within the corporate limits of the City of Fort Collins shall be set to the grade of the street gutter, said grade to be established and marked upon the ground with proper stakes by the city engineer or other competent employee of the city.

Section 3. The distance of the outside line of the curbing from the street shall be as follows: upon College Avenue, Mountain ^{Avenue, 25 feet} ~~and~~ ^{and Xorves Street, Twenty (20) feet} Laporte Avenue ^{16 feet} ~~sixteen (16) feet~~; on all other streets and avenues ~~sixteen (16)~~ ~~feet~~ ^{sixteen (16)} feet.

Section 4. The curbing is to be set in a substantial manner with a slope of two (2) inches to the foot. The height thereof, the quality and dimensions of the stones used in each instance shall be as directed by said Committee upon streets, alleys and bridges.
