

## Relating to Advertisements.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Fort Collins:

Sec. I. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to tack cards, tin or board signs, to post any posters or to distribute circulars, dodgers, samples, sample copies or other bills or devices to advertise patent medicines, patent articles, tobacco, shows, theatrical performances, merchandise or for any other purpose for which advertising signs, posters, circulars, dodgers, bills, cards, tin or board signs or devices that are calculated to attract the attention of the public, without first having obtained a license from the city of Fort Collins so to do for which he shall pay the sum of ~~twenty~~ <sup>fifteen</sup> dollars per annum in advance.

Sec. II. The provisions of section I hereof shall not apply to local merchants, manufactures, Religious, Fraternal or Benevolent Societies of Fort Collins. *College School or other local institutions*

Sec. III. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw posters, dodgers, circulars, bills, samples or devices upon any of the streets or alleys of said city, *or in any vehicle standing thereon.*

Sec. IV. No license for bill posting, distributing or advertising signs shall be issued until the applicant therefor shall have executed a bond to the city of Fort Collins with two or more good and sufficient sureties, residents of this city, in the penal sum of one hundred dollars, conditioned that he or they will in all respects comply with the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. V. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof before the Police Magistrate of said city be fined in a sum not less than five dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars for each offense and shall be imprisoned in the city or County jail until such fine and costs are paid.
