

ORDINANCE No. 6 1900.

Relating to Sanitary Conditions.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL of the CITY of FORT COLLINS

Sec 1 That no night soil, grease trap or cesspool matter shall be deposited or buried in or on any premises within the city limits

Sec 2 All grease traps shall be cleaned at least once a year, or oftener if ordered to do so.

Sec 3 All privy vaults and cesspools must be cleaned wherever the contents thereof shall be within two feet of the top or surface of the ground

Sec. 4 Whenever the use of any vault or cesspool is discontinued, such vault or cesspool must be cleaned to the bottom and filled up with earth or other suitable material and such work must be under the supervision of the City Marshall.

Sec 5 No person, company or corporation shall engage in or conduct the occupation or business known as vault cleaners without having first obtained from the City of Fort Collins a license therefor, the party applying for such license shall pay to the proper collecting officer of the city of Fort Collins the sum of Twenty-five (\$25 00) Dollars as license fee for one year Such person, company or corporation shall be equipped with the most modern and approved appliances for such work

Sec 6 The contents of the privy vaults, grease traps or cesspools within the limits of the city of Fort Collins, shall not be removed therefrom, nor shall the same be transported through any street, alley or public place within the City, except in the most improved sanitary manner, through or by means of air-tight tanks, if soft and mixed with water, and if solid or dry in sheet steel tight covered tanks, in such manner as shall prevent the escape of any noxious or offensive odors, and preserve such contents from sight or exposure during transportation All tools, appliances and vehicles used in such cleaning and removal shall be kept and maintained in perfect sanitary conditions, subject to the inspection of the board of health of the city at all times

Sec 7 It shall be unlawful for persons, companies or corporations engaged in the occupation known as vault cleaners to charge for services rendered by them more than four (\$4 00) dollars per load of five hundred (500) gallons of cesspool or other soft matter, or more than two and one-half (\$2 50) dollars for each grease trap, or more than ten cents per cubic foot for night soil or solid matter removed, or more than four (\$4 00) dollars for opening up and cleaning the bottom and sides of each cesspool, including disinfecting and deodorizing and putting same in first class sanitary condition. The board of health of the city shall designate the dumping grounds upon which such material may be dumped.

Sec 8 Any person or persons failing to comply with, or who violates any of the provisions of the foregoing sections of this ordinance shall be fined a sum not less than five (\$5.00) nor more than twenty-five (\$25 00) dollars for each offense.
