

Ordinance No. 10, 1895.

Relating to sidewalks on Howes and Magnolia streets

Whereas a petition having been presented to the city Council for the construction of stone sidewalks on Howes and Magnolia streets and signed by a majority of the owners of frontage on said streets and

whenever the construction of said sidewalks has been declared a necessity by resolution duly passed and adopted by a majority of the city Council, therefore

Be it Ordained by the City Council of the City of Fort Collins,

Section 1 That stone sidewalks shall be constructed on Howes and Magnolia streets in the city of Fort Collins as follows

Commencing at the South West Corner of Block one hundred and four (104) in said city, thence north along the west side of said Block to the North West corner thereof, thence East on the ~~East~~ <sup>South</sup> side of Magnolia street to the intersection of the walk on College Avenue on the North East Corner of Block One hundred and fourteen (114), such sidewalks to be constructed by the owners of the lots or lands abutting on the same at their expense within thirty (30) days from the time at which this Ordinance shall take effect and then they be relieved from any assessment that may be made for the construction thereof by the city provided that the work so to be done shall in all respects conform to the requirements of the ordinance relating to sidewalks passed and adopted November 17<sup>th</sup> 1884.

Sec. 2 That if the sidewalks mentioned in Section 1 of said Ordinance shall not be constructed by the owners of the lots or lands abutting thereon for the same within the time mentioned in Section 1 then such sidewalks shall be constructed by the city under and in pursuance of the provisions of Ordinance No. 19, concerning the assessment of special charges upon the owners of lots or lands within the corporate limits of the city of Fort Collins passed and adopted September 15<sup>th</sup> 1884, and the expense thereof collected in the manner provided in said ordinance
