in relation to disorderly conduct.

City Council

Be it ordained by the ~~Board of Trustees~~ of the City of Fort Collins:

SECTION 1. That any person who shall maliciously, willfully, or in an abandoned manner, disturb the peace or quiet of any neighborhood or family, within the limits of this corporation, by loud or unusual noises, or by tumultuous or offensive carriage, quarrelling or fighting, or conduct himself, or herself, in a disorderly manner, shall on conviction be fined in any sum not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars.

SECTION 2. Any person or persons found upon ^{any} ~~the streets or alleys,~~ avenue or public ground of the City of Fort Collins, or upon the private property of any person, *within said city* in a state of intoxication shall be liable to arrest, and upon conviction ^{thereof} shall be fined in any sum not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars. *and Costs of Suit*

SECTION 3. Any person or persons fined under the provisions of this Ordinance, who shall not pay such fine and costs assessed, shall be confined in the City jail or County jail, or other place of confinement for prisoners, one day for each two dollars of such fine and costs; or such person may be required to work on the streets or public grounds of the City of Fort Collins, one day for each two dollars of such fine and costs, until the same is fully paid.
