

1995 ANNUAL REPORT
ART IN PUBLIC PLACES

BACKGROUND:

The new Art in Public Places Board was formed and held their first board meeting in July of 1995. Meetings are held the third Thursday of each month at 4 p.m. at the Lincoln Center.

Members who served in 1995 were William Cordiner, Elizabeth Dale, Susan Sternlieb, Joe Vansant, Deanna Harpham, Jim Lynxwiler and Jane Liska-Smith. Susan Sternlieb was appointed Chairperson and William Cordiner was appointed Vice-Chairperson.

Council Liaison was Will Smith.

Cultural Resources Board Liaison was Fran Johnson

Staff Liaisons were Ellen Martin and Mark Breimhorst.

POLICIES & GUIDELINES:

The APP Board has devoted much time to identifying ways in which policies would be administered to specific projects.

The Board has worked with the Purchasing Department and created an RFP to locate and select artists to incorporate in a resource list. This list will be used by project architects, engineers & managers to select design consultants to add to the design team on projects between \$50,000 and \$250,000.

TEMPORARY ART:

The APP Board placed their first temporary artwork by Fort Collins artist Bruce Taylor. Through the collaboration of private property owners, the 350 ft. long sculpture, "Art Moves" was installed in an empty lot on Worthington Ave. off of Drake Road for a period of approximately three weeks in October. This piece was supported by private and public grants, in-kind donations, and \$1,171 from the City of Fort Collins. Additional time and labor was contributed by the artist.

1% PROJECTS;

Stormwater Utility made a presentation to the Board outlining their plans for a new office space in the historical C & S Freight Depot. The APP Board worked with Stormwater's suggestions for the inclusion of art and are now working towards an open competition for a water feature. The Board created the entry form for this competition.

The City Engineering Department made a presentation on the Drake Road Widening Project and presented their brainstorming ideas on placing art in the project. The board discussed creating an entry form for an open competition.

The 1% projects for 1996 are currently being reviewed by the Board.

EDUCATION & AWARENESS:

A sub-committee was formed to help inform the public and educate students regarding Art in Public Places.
