



## ART IN PUBLIC PLACES BOARD 1999 WORK PLAN

### *Introduction:*

The Art in Public Places Board, which was reauthorized in April of 1998, will continue to advise City Council on projects and programs relating to public art, design and aesthetics.

### *Range of Activities Planned for 1999*

#### Design artist projects

The APP Board currently has a list of 12 visual artists on the city's resource list for the middle tier of Design Consultants. These artists work with departments whose projects cost between \$50,000 and \$250,000. The city department funding the construction project pays these consulting fees. These projects are ongoing.

#### The APP Board is currently working on nine 1% projects (those with budgets over \$250,000)

- Civic Center Four Corners Project
- Civic Center Parking Structure

#### Major New Projects in 1999

- Civic Center Transit Center
- Civic Center City Administration Building

#### New Projects and programs

- Submit the Community Art Program (CAP).
- Continue work on an Art Plan for the use of future undesignated funds.
- Develop a written evaluation process for APP projects.
- Advise and make recommendations on changes to rules, regulations, guidelines, policy, administrative, and budgetary matters pertaining to the APP Program.
- Review and make recommendations to City Council on all 1999 APP projects and donations.
- Hire a full-time permanent position for APP in 2000/2001 budget process. This is due to the dramatic growth in the APP program.
