



ART IN PUBLIC PLACES BOARD 1998 WORK PLAN

Introduction:

The Art in Public Places Board, now in its third year, will continue to advise City Council on projects and programs relating to public art.

Current Activity:

The APP Board currently has a list of 26 visual artists on the city's resource list for the middle tier of Design Consultants. These artists work with departments whose projects cost between \$50,000 and \$250,000. These consulting fees are paid by the city department funding the construction project.

The APP Board is currently working on seven 1% projects over \$250,000:

- Utility Service Center Expansion Project
- Front Range Community College Library Project
- Timberline Rd Expansion Project
- Xeriscape Garden Project
- Westfield Park Project
- English Ranch Park Project
- Art Plan

The APP Board's fifth permanent 1% project has been approved by City Council for the artwork on the Timberline Rd. Expansion Project. The project is currently in contract negotiations.

1998 Plan:

Implementing the goals and policies contained in the Art in Public Places Ordinance will be the primary focus for 1998. The board will also focus on preparation for taking the APP Ordinance to City Council for reauthorization. The following is a list of actions that will be implemented in 1998.

- Coordinate public outreach for APP Ordinance reauthorization process.
- Submit an "Art Plan" for the use of undesignated funds.
- Advise and make recommendations on changes to rules, regulations, guidelines, policy, administrative, and budgetary matters pertaining to the APP Program.
- Review and make recommendations to City Council on all 1998 APP Projects.
- Advise and make recommendations to City Council on all donations of art to the City.
- Education & Awareness Program for APP
 - A sub-committee will help inform the public and educate students regarding Art in Public Places.
- Create a maintenance schedule for the city art collection.
- Work with artists and city departments on projects' evaluations.
